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*Resolution and Order Setting Forth Specified Proceedings  
for Pending Declaratory Ruling Petitions*

Pursuant to General Statutes § 4-176 (e) and Connecticut Agency Regulations § 9-7b-65 (c), it is hereby resolved and ordered that the following proceedings are set regarding two pending Declaratory Ruling Petitions: The first is on behalf of Andrew Glassman, regarding the State Contractor Status of Medical Marijuana Industry Licensees, and was received by the Commission on October 25, 2018, from Andrew Glassman; and the second is on behalf of Caitlin Clarkson Pereira, regarding the Use of Public Funds to Offset Candidate's Child Care Costs, received by the Commission on October 19, 2018, from Caitlin Clarkson Pereira.

With respect to the Declaratory Ruling Petition regarding state contractor limitations, the Commission sets the following schedule:

- (a) The Commission directs staff to issue notice of receipt of a petition for declaratory ruling on the SEEC website, and via email to all persons who have requested notice of declaratory rulings;
- (b) The Commission further directs staff to present research regarding the medical marijuana industry licensee program and the application of the state contractor limitations to those licensing arrangements at its regular meeting scheduled for December 19, 2018;
- (c) The Commission directs staff to draft a Proposed Declaratory Ruling 2019-01 for consideration by the Commission at its regular meeting scheduled for January 2019; and
- (d) If the Commission votes to publish for comment the proposed Declaratory Ruling at this January, 2019 meeting, the Commission shall direct staff to post notice of the proposed Declaratory Ruling on the SEEC website and to send notice to all persons who were sent notice of the receipt of the petition, with a comment period to close at 11:59 p.m. one week prior to the regular Commission meeting in February, 2019. If the Commission does not vote to publish for comment the proposed draft at the January 2019 meeting, the Commission shall set an alternative schedule and direct any further proceedings as necessary.

With respect to the Declaratory Ruling Petition regarding the Use of Public Funds to Offset Candidate's Child Care Costs, the Commission sets the following schedule:

- (a) The Commission directs staff to issue notice of receipt of a petition for declaratory ruling on the SEEC website, and via email to all persons who have requested notice of declaratory rulings;

- (b) The Commission further directs staff to present research regarding the approach to childcare costs taken by other jurisdictions with respect to clean elections programs and more generally under campaign finance laws at its regular meeting scheduled for January 2019;
- (c) The Commission directs staff to draft a Proposed Declaratory Ruling 2019-02 for consideration by the Commission at its regular meeting scheduled for February 2019; and
- (d) If the Commission votes to publish for comment the proposed Declaratory Ruling at this February 2019 meeting, the Commission shall direct staff to post notice of the proposed Declaratory Ruling on the SEEC website and to send notice to all persons who were sent notice of the receipt of the petition, with a comment period to close at 11:59 p.m. one week prior to the regular Commission meeting in March, 2019. If the Commission does not vote to publish for comment the proposed draft at the February 2019 meeting, the Commission shall set an alternative schedule and direct any further proceedings as necessary.
