COMMISSION ANNOUNCES PUBLIC GRANT PAYMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS' ELECTION PROGRAM FOR THE 2010 ELECTION CYCLE

HARTFORD, CT— June 10, 2010 – The State Elections Enforcement Commission has awarded public grant payments under the Citizens' Election Program to qualifying candidates.

The Citizens' Election Program is a voluntary program which allows qualifying candidates for statewide offices and the General Assembly to receive full public financing. To qualify for the Program, a candidate must forego PAC money, raise small contributions from individuals and adhere to campaign spending limits and other restrictions.

Number of Participating Candidates

80 General Assembly candidates and 7 Statewide candidates have filed their intent to participate in the Program. The deadline for declaring intent to participate in public campaign financing is July 16th for candidates facing a primary and September 23rd for general election.
