In the Matter of a Complaint by Theodore Pappas, Manchester

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

The Complainant filed the instant complaint in this matter with the Commission pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes § 9-7b. The Complainant alleged that he received phone calls directing him to support a candidate for elective office and also directing him to the wrong polling station. The following are the Commission's findings of fact and conclusions of law:


1. At all times relevant hereto, Complainant was a registered voter in the town of Manchester.
2. On November 13, 2018, Complainant filed a Complaint with the Commission that alleged:
 - a. that on November 13, 2018 at approximately 3:00 p.m. he received a phone call from an unknown source;
 - b. that on November 13, 2018 at approximately 6:00 he received a phone call from an unknown source;
 - c. that, in each of the aforementioned phone calls, the caller urged him to support Republican candidates;
 - d. that, in each of the aforementioned phone calls, the caller identified the wrong polling place for that individual.
3. Subsequently, Commission investigators attempted to contact the Complainant to obtain further information regarding this matter, including by phone, email, and certified mail.
4. None of the Commission investigators' attempts to contact the Complainant were successful.
5. In the absence of a more detailed statement from the Complainant, or any corroborating evidence, the Commission has been unable to identify a Respondent in this matter.
6. Accordingly, it is the determination of the Commission that this matter should be dismissed.

ORDER

The following Order is recommended on the basis of the aforementioned findings:

That this matter be dismissed.
