In the Matter of a Complaint by Louis DeCilio, Stratford

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

The Complainant, Louis DeCilio, filed the instant complaint with the Commission pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes § 9-7b. The Complainant alleged that that Respondents Kathleen Callahan and Karen Tracy violated Connecticut's election laws by failing to accurately report the financial transactions of The *Voices of Stratford PAC*. The following are the Commission's findings of fact and conclusions of law:

- 1. At all times relevant hereto, *Voices of Stratford PAC* was a durational political slate committee registered in the Town of Stratford to make expenditures concerning the November 11, 2019 election.
- 2. On or about July 24, 2019, Respondents Kathleen Callahan and Karen Tracy registered the *Voices of Stratford PAC* as a political slate committee within the Town of Stratford Town Clerk.
- 3. From on or about July 24, 2019 through on or about October 1, 2019, Respondent Kathleen Callahan was the chairperson of *Voices of Stratford PAC*.
- 4. From on or about July 24, 2019 through on or about October 1, 2019, Respondent Karen Tracy was the treasurer of *Voices of Stratford PAC*.
- 5. Complainant alleged that Respondents "intentionally failed to meet the filing deadline and amend the initial report to include additional donors."
- 6. Specifically, Complainant alleged that "[o]n September 3, 2019, the *Voices of Stratford PAC* submitted an inaccurate and incomplete 7th Day Preceding Primary report to the Stratford Town Clerk."
- 7. General Statutes § 9-608 (a) requires that treasurers of political slate committees file a financial disclosure statement "on the seventh day preceding the election."
- 8. General Statutes § 9-608 (c) further requires that such statements include an "itemized accounting of each contribution," and "an itemized accounting of each expenditure[.]"
- 9. General Statutes § 9-622 (8) provides that a person is guilty of an illegal practice if such person "knowingly and wilfully violates any provision of this chapter."

- 10. In the course of the investigation, Commission investigators did confirm that there were some discrepancies in the September 3, 2019 financial disclosure statement of the *Voices of Stratford PAC*.
- 11. However, after investigation it is clear that such discrepancies were either the result of contributors not providing accurate information to the treasurer or ministerial mistakes.
- 12. There was no evidence that any of the errors or omissions contained in the September 3, 2019 financial disclosure statement of the *Voices of Stratford PAC* were knowing or willful.
- 13. Moreover, when the error was brought to the attention of the current treasurer of the *Voices* of *Stratford PAC*, an amended financial disclosure filing was submitted.
- 14. Based upon the forgoing, it is the determination of the Commission that this matter should be dismissed.

ORDER

The following Order is recommended on the basis of the aforementioned findings:

That this matter be dismissed.
